

MAKING HIDING PLACES FOR FROGS AND TOADS



Creating small areas that are dark and cool will help frogs survive in your garden. They can hide from predators, keep cool and maybe even see out a cold winter in there.

Ideas for materials:

- An old flowerpot
- Dead leaves
- Rocks, stones or bricks
- Logs
- Bark
- Sticks
- Pieces of wood or planks



What to do:

Step 1: Choose a spot in the garden.

Pick a quiet corner that won't be disturbed.

Step 2: Make a mini shelter.

Use your materials to create a shelter big enough for a frog or toad to crawl into.

Step 3: Add some bedding.

Put some leaves, sticks or grass inside the shelter to provide extra places to hide

There's no set way to do this - just use your imagination to create a sheltered space.
